



## UNICA STUDENT CONFERENCE

### STUDENTS' COMMITMENTS AND GUIDELINES

**By organising the UNICA Student Conference, the Network of Universities from the Capitals of Europe undertakes to:**

1. Give students a platform to share their views on issues which are crucial to Europe's future development;
2. Offer them an opportunity to gain international experience;
3. Provide them with new skills, such as an ability to work and to cooperate with their peers from different countries, cultures and backgrounds;
4. Encourage them to formulate their own opinions and recommendations;
5. Support their initiatives included in the final document of the Conference.

**The Participants of the UNICA Student Conference, aware of their responsibilities as Representatives of Universities from the Capitals of Europe, hereby undertake to:**

#### Before the Conference

1. Duly examine and prepare the themes that will be discussed in the forum they have chosen to attend;
2. Use numerous and diversified sources in order to get an unbiased overview of the topics;
3. Consult the academic tutor appointed by the University to receive guidance and advice;

#### During the Conference:

1. Attend all the meetings that figure in the Conference's official programme;
2. Participate in discussion forums in an active way, demonstrating their commitment, knowledge of the matter and a fluency in English;
3. Formulate the final document of the Conference, which will sum up their deliberations and will contain their views and recommendations;
4. Duly represent their Home University by displaying their dedication during official and unofficial events of the Conference.

#### After the conference:

1. Present the local student community with the outcomes of the Conference via student media (i.e. articles and pictures in university newspapers, short reports for the university website, radio or TV);
2. Provide a Conference Report, giving the Home University an insight into the Conference's course of events, the Students' involvement, as well as their personal opinions and impressions.
